## List of documents confirming language proficiency

## **1.** Documents certifying proficiency in English at a minimum level of B2 are:

- 1) a certificate of completion of secondary education abroad, where classes were conducted in the same foreign language as the language in which studies will be conducted in the Republic of Poland; ;
- 2) a diploma of completion of first- or second-cycle studies in the Republic of Poland or abroad in the field of foreign language philology or applied linguistics, provided that the number of hours of practical foreign language learning, confirmed by a diploma supplement or certificate, was at least 500 hours in relation to that particular foreign language;
- 3) a secondary school leaving certificate obtained in the Republic of Poland with a positive grade in an advanced language examination with a score of at least 60%;
- 4) International Baccalaureate Diploma;
- 5) European Baccalaureate Diploma;
- 6) certificates and diplomas confirming knowledge of foreign languages at the following levels of language proficiency in accordance with the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages:
  - a) certificates and diplomas issued by institutions affiliated with the Association of Language Testers in Europe (ALTE) ALTE Level 3 (B2), ALTE Level 4 (C1), ALTE Level 5 (C2), in particular the following certificates:
    - B2 First, C1 Advanced, C2 Proficiency, B2 Business Vantage, C1 Business Higher, Certificate in English for International Business and Trade (CEIBT),
    - Trinity College London: ESOL Skills for Life B2 (Level 1), C1 (Level 2), Integrated Skills in English (ISE) – B2 (ISE II), C1 (ISE III), C2 (ISE IV),
    - telc GmbH, WBT Weiterbildungs-Testsysteme GmbH in particular the following certificates: B2 Certificate in English – advantage, B2 Certificate in English for Business Purposes – advantage, Certificate in English for Technical Purposes (B2), telc English B2, telc English B2 Business, telc English B2-C1 Business, telc English B2 Technical, telc English B2–C1 University; telc English C1,

  - not subject to approval in accordance with Article 144(5) of the Act on foreigners and in respect of which no decision has been issued prohibiting the admission of foreigners, as referred to in Article 144a(1) of that Act – after conducting an examination;
- d) certificate issued by an institution that was a member of the Association of Language Testers in Europe (ALTE) at the time of issue - ALTE Level 3 (B2), ALTE Level 4 (C1), ALTE Level 5 (C2).

## 2. Documents certifying proficiency in Polish at a level of at least B2 are:

- 1) certificate of proficiency in Polish referred to in Article 11a(2) of the Act of 7 October 1999 on the Polish language (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1556) levels B2, C1, and C2;
- 2) certificates of the following:
  - a) European Consortium for the Certificate of Attainment in Modern Languages (ECL)– B2 and C1 level;
  - b) telc GmbH, WBT Weiterbildungs-Testsysteme GmbH (TELC) –B2 level;
- 3) a certificate confirming knowledge of Polish at a level of proficiency not lower than B2 in accordance with the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, issued by a university:
  - a) approved by the minister responsible for internal affairs for the purpose of admitting foreigners to undertake or continue studies in accordance with Article 144(4) of the Act of 12 December 2013 on foreigners or

- b) not subject to approval in accordance with Article 144(5) of the Act on foreigners and in respect of which no decision has been issued prohibiting the admission of foreigners, as referred to in Article 144a(1) of that Act after conducting an examination;
- 4) certificate of completion of a one-year preparatory course for university studies;
- 5) a diploma of completion of first- or second-cycle studies or long-cycle studies with Polish as the language of instruction at a university operating within the higher education system of the Republic of Poland.
