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Introduction

The following practical vocational skills chart has been introduced with the aim of keeping record of professional competencies acquired by a Bachelor's student in the course of practical education, in keeping with the profile of a graduate of vocational nursing studies and relevant teaching standards.

The vocational skills chart allows to assess the degree of practical acquisition of knowledge and skills in the course of education.

Practical classes are conducted by academic teachers in two forms: as medical simulation and in hospital department conditions, whereas work placements take place under the supervision of mentors (work placement supervisor in a given facility) in healthcare institutions, hospitals, clinics, residential and nursing care homes, hospices. Intra-year work placements take place in facilities affiliated to the university, whereas summer work placements — as declared by the student — in a Collegium Medicum facility or other selected institution, e.g. in the student's place of residence.

A prerequisite for commencing work placement in a selected facility is a positive evaluation of the facility and work placement mentor, in accordance with criteria specified in section Criteria for selection and evaluation of facilities providing practical education to FoHS students and Criteria for selection of work placement mentor for the Nursing programme. Decision on the approval of a facility is made by the Head of the unit/work placement Supervisor appointed by the Head of the unit, whose specialty covers the content of the work placement. Facility and mentor assessment sheets submitted by the student should be filled out legibly, signed and stamped. A preliminary consent of an authorised agent to undertake work placement at the selected facility should be attached to the said assessment sheets. A student's application for individual work placement schedule should include a clear indication of the scope (subject) of work placement, the name of facility, department and mentor, and the dates of commencement and completion of the placement. Upon receiving consent of the Head of the unit/work placement Supervisor, the student submits a request - addressed to the Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences - for entering into agreement with the selected facility, and then submits all relevant documentation to the Dean's Office. This procedure is crucial for completing formalities leading to signing an agreement between the university and the facility.

Before commencing work placement in a selected facility, a student ought to print the so-called mentor's kit (for a given subject) and submit it to the person supervising the student's work placement. The mentor's kit includes the programme content of the work placement, expected learning outcomes, criteria for verifying the achievement of expected learning outcomes, and work placement rules.

The conditions for obtaining credit for individual practical skills are specified in this document. ASSESSMENT SHOULD BE CARRIED OUT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE EUROPEAN ASSESSMENT SYSTEM DESCRIBED IN THIS DOCUMENT (grade, NOT credit). The student is obliged to systematically obtain confirmation entries for all practical skills. The student should demonstrate willingness to improve their practical skills and to obtain a grade reflecting their independent mastery of those skills.

Entries and confirmation of the successful completion of practical classes and work placements are made by academic teachers or mentors. Entries should be clear and legible, and should include notes on the student's conduct.

Upon completion of work placement in a given teaching cycle, the student is obliged to print and fill out the *Work placement evaluation questionnaire*, separately for each individual subject. The questionnaire as well as facility and mentor evaluation sheets are available on the website of the Faculty of Health Sciences.

Upon completion of all practical classes and work placements included in the plan of study, the coordinator of programme-specific work placement carries out verification in terms of its completion, obtaining a positive grade and formal correctness of entries in the chart.

Submission of the Skills Chart to the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Health Sciences before the summer examination session at the 3rd year of study constitutes a necessary condition for being allowed to take the final diploma examination.

1. Graduate profile

The role of a nurse is defined by functions that a graduate should be prepared to serve, namely:

- 1. Providing and managing healthcare services through:
 - identifying the needs of an individual, a group or community, and determining the required and available resources needed to meet those needs;
 - planning and providing nursing care, and determining appropriate nursing methods and priorities;
 - providing preventive, diagnostic, treatment and rehabilitation services in accordance with applicable regulations;
 - supporting an individual or family in the process of recovering health and gaining independence in illness or disability through participation in all forms of care and self-care;
 - following the principles of professional ethics;
 - cooperating with professionals with the aim of providing an individual and family with comprehensive health care;
 - organising and maintaining a safe healthcare and work environment;
 - keeping record of all stages of the nursing process and using the information in the evaluation of health care provided.
- 2. Providing health promotion and education through:
 - assessing individual knowledge and skills necessary for maintaining and improving health;
 - supporting an individual, family or social group in leading a healthy lifestyle;
 - educating an individual, family or social group on ways of maintaining and improving health;
 - participating in health-related educational campaigns.
- 3. Acting as a member of the healthcare team through:
 - cooperating with an individual, family, and other members of the healthcare team in the planning and provision of healthcare services;
 - cooperating with other members of the healthcare team with the aim of maintaining a safe healthcare and team work environment;
 - communicating with a patient, family, and other members of the healthcare team.
- 4. Improving nursing practice, critical thinking and research activity through:
 - making practical use of up-to-date knowledge in medical and social sciences, nursing theory, profession and healthcare-related legal regulations;
 - implementing approved research results into nursing practice;
 - participating in research projects with the aim of improving knowledge in nursing.

2. Practical teaching objectives and methods

Practical education (in the form of practical classes and work placements) aims at providing students with a possibility to practically apply their knowledge and skills in real-life conditions and to improve their problem-solving skills when working in facilities involved in nursing practice, such as healthcare institutions and residential care homes. Moreover, students can improve their knowledge and skills in the scope of clinical subjects through participation in high-fidelity medical simulation classes. Teaching process built around realistic scenarios and provided in educational units equipped with appropriate high-fidelity simulation equipment allows students to gain knowledge and skills based on the latest achievements in medicine, improve their communication and interdisciplinary teamwork skills, and shape professional attitudes. At the same time, it allows to protect real patients from unnecessary risk.

The objectives of the work placement include:

- training skills related to patient observation and health data collection, personal hygiene and care activities, nursing, treatment, diagnostic and rehabilitation procedures, communication, and medical record management;
- improving skills in selecting nursing methods and techniques depending on the situation, patient status and working conditions;
- improving skills in organising own work, cooperation and team work, and independent decisionmaking;
- shaping personal attitudes necessary for the profession;
- evaluating the level of preparation for nursing practice.

It is proposed that the practical education of nurses includes such stimulating methods as: participation in the work of nurses (pair work, "teacher-student" method), case study, scenario-based learning, simulation, discussion-based learning, demonstration and explanation, presentation, instruction, project work, acting as a facilitator, emphasising the positive outcomes of student work.

3. Organisation and course of work placement – duties of mentor (work placement supervisor)

The mentor is obliged to:

- 1. Organise the course of work placement within the selected facility;
- 2. Exercise constant supervision of the course of work placement;
- 3. Set assignments included in the work placement programme;
- 4. Give instructions and demonstrations;
- 5. Assess the knowledge and skills of students;
- 6. Fill out relevant documentation pertaining to work placement;
- 7. Supervise students and respect their rights;
- 8. Ensure the right conditions for good rapport with medical personnel, students and the mentor;
- 9. Take responsibility for assignments and procedures performed by students.

The mentor has the right to:

- 1. Require that students obey work placement regulations and execute relevant provisions;
- 2. Keep classes from happening or continuing in case of any breach of these regulations or internal regulations of the facility;
- 3. Assess and give opinion on students' work;
- 4. Give admonition, reprimand and praise;
- 5. Apply for rewarding a student to the university authorities;
- 6. Adapt or modify the content of classes depending on the situation and conditions in the facility where work placement is taking place;
- 7. Require students to complete an extra written assignment or course content, if deemed necessary for giving credit for work placement;
- 8. Appoint a temporary stand-in to supervise students, but only after prior arrangement with work placement coordinator and head of the unit.

The mentor cannot:

- **1.** Require that students do their work placement in a different facility.
- **2.** Get students involved in assignments not related to the work placement programme or performed without due supervision.
- Increase student workload so that it goes beyond the scheduled time limit or programme content.

4. Rules pertaining to practical classes and work placement – student's rights and duties

The student has the right to:

- 1. Actively participate in the process of knowledge and skills acquisition;
- 2. Seek clarification in case of any doubts related to the content and course of study;
- 3. Effectively cooperate in the process of teaching and learning;
- 4. Openly express their opinion related to issues covered during classes, without hurting anyone's dignity;
- 5. Obtain a continuous and end-of-course assessment of their knowledge and skills from the academic teacher or mentor:
- 6. Be allowed to have one 30-minute lunch break during classes.

The student is obliged to:

- 1. Show interest in the profession;
- 2. Participate in classes according to schedule;
- 3. Be punctual and avoid absences;
- 4. Explain the reasons for their absence and make up for missed classes in the time and mode specified by the teacher;
- 5. Carry out assignments specified in the programme and set by the teacher or mentor;
- 6. Perform nursing procedures in accordance with applicable rules, and upon consent and under supervision of the teacher or mentor;
- 7. Follow the principles of patient safety in the inpatient and outpatient environment;
- 8. Observe professional secrecy and follow the principles of professional ethics;
- 9. Respect the personal dignity of healthcare team members;
- 10. Care for a positive atmosphere and be kind towards colleagues and the medical personnel;
- 11. Dress appropriately (medical uniform) and maintain an aesthetic looks;
- 12. Hold a valid medical record book;
- 13. Be kind, sympathetic and patient towards patients and their families;
- 14. Care for the property of the facility; keep it tidy and clean;
- 15. Comply with the internal regulations of the hospital, department, medical simulation rooms.

Requirements for obtaining credit for practical classes and work placement

The final grade is based on the assessment of a student's intellectual, practical and manual skills, as well as attitude and conduct.

- 1. Regular attendance and active participation in classes.
- 2. Managing medical records. Completing a written assignment nursing care plan for a patient.
- 3. The right attitude towards patients, healthcare team, profession and the learning process.

Attitude towards patients:

- tact, manners, tolerance towards patients and their families, understanding the individual needs of a patient and their family;
- providing support and showing compassion for a patient and their family sympathy,
 patience;
- respecting patient rights.

Attitude towards healthcare team:

- good manners;
- kindness towards colleagues, medical personnel;
- ability to work in a team (communicating, listening, attempting to solve problems).

Attitude towards the profession and education

- devotion to nursing practice (motivation, interest, striving to improve the quality of services provided);
- improving the methods and organisation of own work (conscientiousness, independent decision-making, adaptation to changes);
- career aspirations (improving medical knowledge, interest in the development of nursing care services, motivation to pursue continuous education);
- behaviour self-assessment (attitude to mistakes, taking responsibility, self-assessment of knowledge, skills and capabilities).

Attitude towards the regulations:

- being punctual, avoiding absences, complying with the regulations;
- following medical dress code, aesthetic appearance.
