LEARNING OBJECTIVES

During the work placement, the student should acquire the skills necessary for impeccable performance of all physiotherapeutic procedures as part of the functioning of rehabilitation teams and controlling the effectiveness of the physiotherapy process in the scope covered by the subject of the placement.

ORGANISATION OF THE WORK PLACEMENT

- I. As part of the studies, the work placement takes place in Collegium Medicum units.
- II. After obtaining the Dean's consent, a student may perform a work placement at a rehabilitation facility which has concluded a contract with the NFZ for the implementation of services with a profile consistent with the scope of the work placement and has the possibility to implement the work placement program. The student is obliged to submit to the Dean a written confirmation of the student's admission to the work placement, issued by the head of the rehabilitation facility **(applies only to students of part-time studies)**.
- III. Entry in the practical vocational skills chart is made by the person responsible for the work placement after all statutory tasks have been completed. Any doubts should be reported to the Work Placement Coordinator.
- IV. During the work placement, the student describes the case study of their choice.
- V. Health and safety regulations of a given unit apply on internships.
- VI. If the practical vocational skills chart is lost, the student is required to complete all entries in the duplicate.
- VII. The final crediting of the work placement is made in the practical vocational skills chart, after the work placement supervisor approves it.
- VIII. Total duration of the work placement: 1560 hours (57 ECTS), including:
 - **Introductory Assistant Work Placement (Holiday)** - 150 hours (5 ECTS);
 - **Holiday Work Placement – laboratory for kinesiotherapy** - 300 hours (10 ECTS).
 - **Intra-year Work Placement - clinical physiotherapy, physical therapy and massage work placement** - 710 hours (28 ECTS)
 - **Specialised Holiday Work Placement - elective** - 400 hours (14 ECTS)
 - **Clinical physiotherapy, physical therapy and massage work placement**
