How to apply for a room in student House no 3?

You need to submit an application form (download from this website). The completed form should be emailed to: ds3@cm.umk.pl

The application form can be submitted only by persons who are students of NCU Collegium Medicum, including persons admitted to the 1st year of studies. Applications for a place in the dormitory cannot be submitted before admission (during the recruitment process).

Is the number of places limited?

Yes, there are 252 places in total (in 108 single rooms and 72 double rooms).

Places are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Those students who don't apply before the places run out will have to find accommodation on their own.

Will I get a room for the entire duration of studies?

No, if you wish to stay in the dorm, the application form has to be submitted each year.

Are there any extra charges apart from the accommodation fee?

No, the fee includes utilities (water, electricity, heating) and the Internet.

Is there Internet access in the dorm?

Yes, there is free wi-fi Internet for students.

Is there a parking lot for residents?

Yes, there is a free parking lot for residents of the dorm.

Can I keep an animal in my room?

No, there is a strict ban on keeping animals, including small ones (fish, hamster, etc.).

What happens to residents who don't comply with the dorm regulations?

Residents who breach student house regulations are removed from the dorm and can no longer apply for a room in that dorm.

Can I leave my belonging in the room when I leave for the holidays?

No, after the academic year ends, all rooms must be emptied. You can store your belongings e.g. in a rented storage place in Bydgoszcz.

Do I have to clean my room by myself?

Yes, every resident is obliged to clean their room by themselves. The rooms, kitchens and bathrooms must be kept clean and orderly – otherwise, a resident may be removed from the student house. When checking out for holidays, each resident must leave their room in the same condition as it was received when checking in – otherwise, they won't get a room in the next academic year.

What equipment and amenities are available?

In the room: bedding (pillow, duvet, bedsheet), blanket In the kitchen: microwave, fridge, oven, plates, cutlery To borrow: laundry dryer, vacuum cleaner, iron

How can I pay for my room at the dorm?

The payment can only by made via a regular bank transfer. It's not possible to pay by cash or credit card. Information necessary for making the payment are provided by the Manager of the Student House. If your bank transfer fees are too high, you can make one payment for a few months in advance.

What is the deposit, how much is it and is it refunded?

The deposit is a guarantee fee taken for the duration of stay at the dorm. The amount is equal to one month's rent. It is refunded when a student leaves the student house for good. The deposit is used to cover the costs of any damage made by the student when living in the dorm.

Can my parents or friends visit a resident?

Yes, provided that there are no extraordinary regulations in force which would ban such visits (e.g. for epidemic safety). Guests can stay until 11 pm. Staying for the night requires paying for the stay. "Smuggling" guests might result in the resident being removed from the dorm.

Are there any shops nearby?

Yes, there are a few larger shops within walking distance from the dorm, such as Lidl, Biedronka, L'Eclerc, Focus Mall.

Is there a canteen in the dorm? Does the dorm provide catering services?

No, there is no canteen or shop in the dorm.

Nie, w akademiku nie ma stołówki ani sklepu. Students have to provide their own food. Residents have access to an equipped kitchen (one kitchen for each pair of rooms) where they can cook meals.

Can I have a whole double room for myself?

Yes, but only if there are vacancies and no students taking those places.

Where do I get my key when I arrive?

Your key-card will be available at the 24/7 reception desk.

What if I would like to get a room in Student House no. 1 or 2?

Student House no. 1 is the furthest from the centre of the city, so international students rarely stay there. It's located 20 km from the main hospital campus, in the furthest district of Bydgoszcz. Student House no. 2 is in the very centre of the city, but it is mostly occupied by Polish students (international too, but not so many). It's also much smaller than the remaining two dormitories, so the number of places is very limited. Student House no. 3 is dedicated to international students. It is also located in the centre, next to University Hospital no. 1 in which students have a lot of classes. Also, the English Division office is located inside Student House no. 3.
